Lots of our spring flowers came with European settlers to North America

Snowdrops (*Galanthus nivallis*) were among the first plants to flower in Europe. In England they were called candlemas bells, because they were used as decorations at Candlemas, February 2, celebration of the Purification of Saint Mary. Other old names include Mary's bells, dingle-dangle, snow-piercers and fair-maid-of-February. They were often planted in graveyards, and for that reason or because they are white like a shroud, they developed a reputation as associated with death. Picking them and bringing them into the house meant a death in the immediate family. The name seems obvious, a white flower in spring called snowdrop, but an alternate explanation was that the name we use today is based on pearl earrings very popular in the 16th century that were called snowdrops. Daffodils (*Narcissus pseudo-narcissus*) grew wild in the meadows of Europe, as did their relatives that we call paperwhites, narcissus and jonquils today. Daffydowndilly is an actual common name from 16th century England. Daffodils are poisonous, so were grown for the medicinal value, the roots to dry out a nasty deep wound, for example or taken boiled to induce vomiting. Just as today, they were very popular spring flowers. The *Book of Secrets of Albertus Magnus*, printed in the mid 1500s from an older manuscript (but almost certainly not written by Albertus Magnus, 12th C) says that it "suffereth not a devil in the house" and that if a man bear with him a root of it in the night, he shall not fear. Carrying them was lucky and would relieve melancholy.



Periwinkles (*Vinca minor* and *Vinca major*) have been grown since Roman times. They are evergreen in most of Europe and so associated with immortality. Consequently they were often planted on the graves of children. They were also made into garlands and chaplets for the condemned, the logic of that not obvious to me. The name periwinkle comes from *vincapervinca*, its name in colloquial Latin, from *vincire*, to bind, which by the Middle Ages had become *pervenke* (and similar spellings). The vining nature of the plant is probably responsible for them as a symbol of married love. They were made into many love knots. *The Book of Secrets of Albertus Magnus* said "When it is beaten unto powder with worms of the earth wrapped about it, and with an herb called *Semperviva*, the English Houseleek, it induceth love between man and wife, if it be used in their meats." For generations couples planted them in their gardens for a long and happy marriage. Carrying periwinkles would bring you money and keep away frightening animals, including snakes, and evil spirits.

<u>The Book of Secrets of Albertus Magnus</u> is now online. The editors state that Elizabethan readers probably didn't believe much of it, but they read it.
