

Haggis of Unser Hafen

Mediæval Skyscrapers

Imagine the difference in buildings from your one- perhaps two-storey cottage and a Gothic cathedral.

St Margaret, Hales, England



Salisbury Cathedral, England, built 1220-1320





Somehow within about 100 years mediæval builders went from small churches to cathedrals which are taller than the Statue of Liberty. From the small 12th Century Norman church of St.

Margaret in Hales, England, with its later additions of the rounded Romanesque arches and the pointed Gothic window,

through the Romanesque style of the early part of St. Albans Cathedral, completed in 1115, with its rounded arches and low, heavy buttresses holding up heavy walls, we move quickly beyond to the Gothic skyscrapers.

The Romanesque builders began to display the growing desire to create a space to reflect the glory of God by building larger churches with the upper walls and ceilings supported by large, rounded arches on the interior, and heavy buttresses on the exterior. The weight of the walls necessitated small windows, creating a dark environment.



These great cathedrals, the seat of the bishop who headed each diocese (the sacred equivalent of the state capital), in general took a hundred years to complete. Their monumental size included amazing carvings in stone and wood portraying such things as saints, gargoyles (monsters), and geometric designs, and elaborate stained glass windows which often tell Biblical stories as well as portraying important people. But with few windows the interior darkness did not reflect the light of God.

Inspired by the desire for light, the architects took the walls higher. This required much taller buttresses to support the walls and roof. With correct placement in line with the slope of the roof, the buttresses could be opened up, and great spaces could be left in the walls for windows. To raise height the interior supporting arches became taller and pointed. Interior support was given by vaulted ceilings.



St. Denis, Paris, France

The earliest Gothic cathedral, completed in 1144, is St. Denis in Paris. Notice the pointed arches, the upper level windows, and that the earlier wooden ceiling of St. Albans has now been replaced by the vaulted ceiling which gives more support for the roof and walls.


Cities began to compete for the finest, tallest cathedral. While Amiens, France, was building their cathedral, 35 miles away the city of Beauvais decided to compete, building theirs taller. Using the Biblical dimensions of the Temple of Soloman, Amiens converted cubits into the Roman foot, but Beauvais used the taller Royal foot. Their visions of glory backfired when, during building part of the vaulted ceiling crashed to the floor. Later in the 16th century during a solemn procession stones from the ceiling began falling again, requiring all to rush out of the building being chased by the dust of the collapse.


Winchester Cathedral south wall (right side) bowing out. Notice the rods across the aisle just below the arches. (My photo)

If the flying buttresses were placed incorrectly, the walls would bulge outward, creating dangerous instability. If the water-table was too shallow the cathedral would sink, causing a multitude of problems. Winchester Cathedral in England has sunk, the crypt flooding frequently. A diver was sent down to shore up the foundations, and its walls have been tied together with steel rods to prevent collapse. Even then, one can see the south wall leaning outward.




Winchester Cathedral's Romanesque north transept (My photo)

Winchester is a prime example of the architecture changing as building progressed. The north transept is Romanesque with lovely rounded arches, while the nave is very Gothic with its pointed arches, fan-vaulted ceiling and large clerestory windows giving lots of light.




Winchester Cathedral nave with fan-vaulted ceiling. (My photo)



This drawing and photo displays flying buttresses. Notice the large windows between each buttress, and that the buttresses are no longer completely attached to the walls, hence 'flying.'

In the drawing we see the nave of a cathedral. The short side arches below the black roof supports are the aisles. The level between the roof of the aisles and the lower flying buttress is the triforium, and the top level is the clerestory with the largest windows.



Here we see a diagram showing the floor plan of Winchester Cathedral, colour-coded to designate building history.

The great west end entrance is on the left of the diagram. The black transepts are the earliest sections with the rounded Romanesque arches. The choir sits in the crossing, where the nave and transepts cross, and the altar is at the connexion of the blue and red section. The retrochoir, behind the altar, is usually space for special burials or a chapel, and the thin section on the right is a small chapel. Often the retrochoir has small chapels radiating from it, each dedicated to someone or something different.
